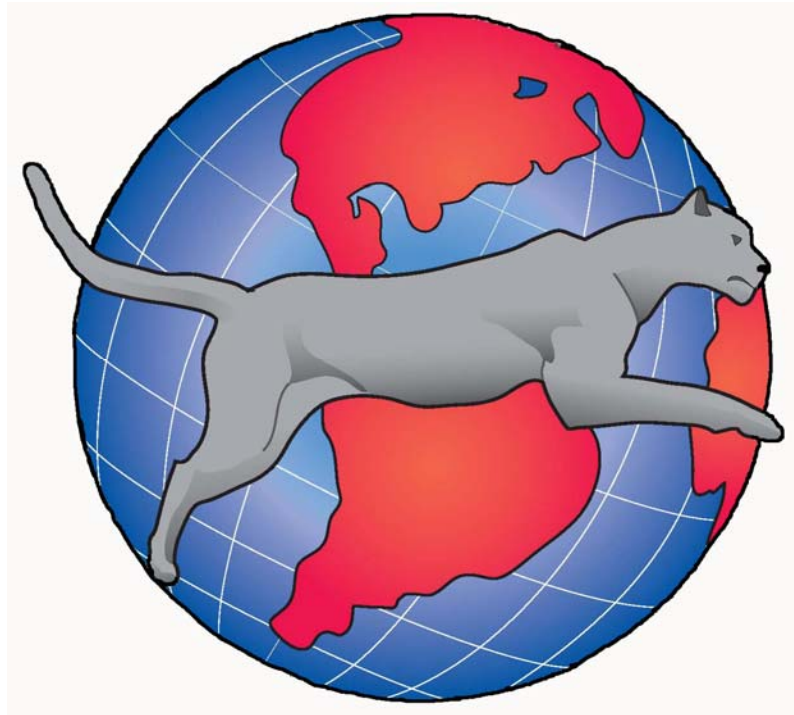

## Welcome to the Colin Powell Elementary School Community!

We're glad your child or children are attending this school. Colin Powell opened in September 2003 and was dedicated in June 2004. The purpose of this guide is to give you an overview of the Colin Powell PTA, help you see where you can get involved, and preview some of the PTA and school activities throughout the school year.

## So Just What is a PTA?

"PTA" stands for "Parent Teacher Association," which is represented at three levels in the United States:

- **The National PTA**—was founded in 1897 in Washington, DC as the "National Congress of Mothers"
- **The State PTA**—pursues the goals and objectives of the National PTA at the state level.
- **The Local PTA**—follows the goals and guidance of the state and national PTA, the local PTA works within each school to meet the needs of the children at that school.

Every person who joins a local PTA automatically becomes a member of both the state and National PTAs. The national PTA web site is [www.pta.org](http://www.pta.org) and the Virginia PTA website is [www.vapta.org](http://www.vapta.org).

## What's the PTA's Mission and Purpose?

The National, State, and Local PTA all share the same mission and purpose. As you will see (or have already seen!), everything the Colin Powell PTA does is in pursuit of the overall PTA's stated mission and purpose.

## The PTA's Mission

This is the three-part Mission that applies to all levels of the PTA:

- To support and speak on behalf of children and youth in the schools, in the community, and before governmental bodies and other organizations that make decisions affecting children;
- To assist parents in developing the skills they need to raise and protect their children; and
- To encourage parent and public involvement in the public schools of this nation.

The PTA's Mission is really a set of clear, unwavering goals that guide everything that any local PTA or its members does. The PTA Mission really answers the question, "What's the PTA all about?"

## The PTA's Purpose

Likewise, the PTA also has more specific objectives. Basically, the PTA purpose answers the question, "What specifically does the PTA try to do?" Here, then, is the PTA's purpose, at all three levels:

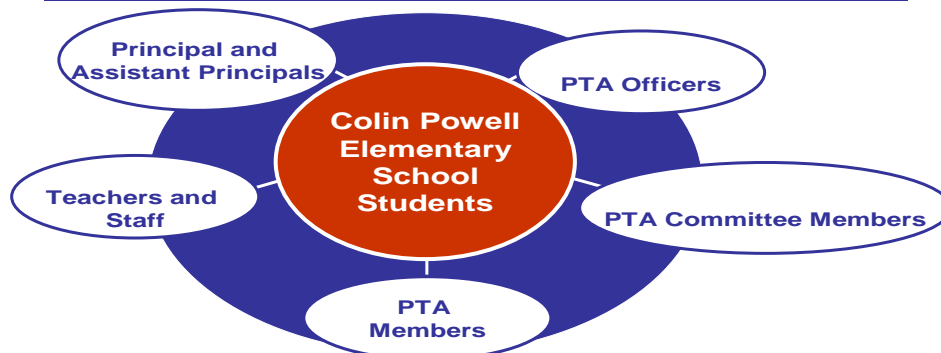
- To promote the welfare of the children and youth in home, school, community, and place of worship.
- To raise the standards of home life.
- To secure adequate laws for the care and protection of children and youth.
- To bring into closer relation the home and the school, that parents and teachers may cooperate intelligently in the education of children and youth.
- To develop between educators and the general public such united efforts as will secure for all children and youth the highest advantages in physical, mental, social, and spiritual education.

## So, What About the Colin Powell PTA?

The Colin Powell PTA is a group of concerned parents, guardians, family members, teachers, administrators, and school staff—all focused on a single objective: the well-being of our children.

As this picture shows, the Powell PTA focuses attention on the needs of our children (Powell's students) by connecting the PTA (our officers, committees, and members) with the School (the principal and his team, the teachers, and staff).

## ***How are We Organized?***

Powell PTA officers include a President, a 1<sup>st</sup> Vice-President (Programs and Activities), a 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice-President (Ways and Means), a Secretary, and a Treasurer. The Powell PTA also includes numerous committee chairpersons or coordinators, who serve as the point of contact for the committee or activity they represent.

Each committee chair is aligned with a designated PTA officer. This relationship creates a communication channel between the committees and the PTA leadership, and provides support and guidance to those chairpersons who may need it.

We operate based on a calendar that has been coordinated with the school's administrators prior to the start of the school year

## **It's All About Your Membership!**

***Our goal is to have every household with at least one member!***

We believe the strength of our school depends on the strength of parent involvement with the school, and in the lives of their children. And we know that membership in the Colin Powell PTA is one of the best ways to support our school and our kids.

## ***How Do I Join?***

The Powell PTA registers members each year—typically at the start of school year in September. This years a membership drive was held in the Fall to raise awareness about the Colin Powell PTA, what it's about, and the benefits of becoming a member. Membership information was also sent home in the children's weekly folders, and sign-ups were held at "Back-to-School Night. However, joining is not limited to those times. Anyone can join the PTA throughout the school year.

You don't have to have a child enrolled in the school to be a member. Grandparents, friends, neighbors and community members are welcomed and encouraged to become PTA members.

### ***What Does it Mean to Become a Member?***

When you become a member, you have the ability to vote and make decisions that affect the school and your kids. Therefore, as a member, you actually become part of the PTA's "board of directors."

### ***How Much Does it Cost?***

Here are the Powell PTA membership fees. As you can see a portion of each membership fee collected is, by law, contributed to the State PTA, to help with its operating expenses.

The amount is less in recognition that most of our staff have children at other schools and are PTA members where their children attend)

## **Staying Connected Through Monthly PTA Meetings**

The PTA usually meets the first Tuesday of every month in the school library. All members and non-members are welcome to attend. The meetings typically start at 7 pm and run an hour. There are times throughout the year where special speakers may talk about certain subjects prior to the start of the meeting.

## **How do we Communicate?**

Through out the school year, we use a variety of ways to communicate with PTA members and our school community. Some of these communication channels are directly supported by the PTA and some are supported by the school. You can expect to see, read, hear or receive the following through out the school year. Here's a look at how PTA communication works throughout the year...

**Weekly Tuesday Folder** Each Tuesday, classroom teachers send a big white envelope home in the children's backpacks. We call these envelopes "Tuesday folders". The "folder" consists of your child's completed work from the previous week, a weekly newsletter

- from the administration, and various flyers about upcoming activities at the school. Parents sign the outside of the folder to indicate that they've received the contents inside.
- Weekly Newsletter** This is a letter prepared by the principals. It is no more than two pages long and is typically on yellow paper. It highlights events, information, etc. that you may need to be aware of.
- Puma Post** This is the PTA monthly newsletter. It provides detail information of current and future activities taking place in or around the school community.
- Flyers** Through out the year, flyers will be placed in your child's Tuesday folder. They typically announce activities that are coming up from one of the PTA's committees or even the school directly. Sometimes flyers are used to request volunteer assistance with school or PTA activities.
- Volunteer Email** Often, announcements and requests for volunteer assistance are made through email. To receive this information, parents and guardians can provide their email address to the PTA of a form provided at Back-to-School Night. Forms are also available on the school website, under the PTA link. You can also send email to the volunteer coordinator to have your email address added to the distribution list. - Web Site** The school has a website and the PTA has a link there. The school website is <http://www.fcps.edu/powelles> and the url for the Powell PTA is [www.cpespta.org](http://www.cpespta.org) and you can also access information on what is going on in at all of the Fairfax County schools by going to [www.fcps.edu](http://www.fcps.edu)
- CPNN** The Colin Powell News Network is a morning news show presented every morning that is seen by the students in their classrooms. It is presented by students via the in-house studio. Your kids receive information concerning activities and items taking place at the school. The PTA uses this show to advertise activities coming up as well.
- PTA Calendar** The calendar is posted on the school web site under PTA. It provides information on the activities and programs coming up at the school throughout the year

## Bringing Good Things to Kids

### —Programs Sponsored by the Colin Powell PTA

The PTA sponsors many programs through out the school year. Many of these programs are made possible due to fundraising events. Fundraising will be discussed in another section. The programs offered help enrich our children's education experience while attending Powell. Your participation in fundraising events, by being a member or volunteering your time makes possible the following:

Here are a few highlights of the many ways the Powell PTA works to "Bring Good Things to Kids" at Powell....

#### **Program/Activity    Brief Description**

***Arts in School*** Parent volunteers to go into the classroom and share on a monthly basis and share biographical information about a particular artist, the artist's work and style. A project accompanies the lesson with all supplies and materials provided by the PTA and the Greater Reston Art Center (GRACE). This program is available to classrooms in which the teacher has requested it, provided there is a volunteer to present the lesson.

***Cultural Arts*** In school assemblies that include:

- Program***
- Visits by authors, poets, storytellers, and music groups.
  - Visits by individuals that make learning fun academic topics like science and history.

***Field Trips*** PTA pays for buses needed for a portion of field trips for all grades through out the year.

***Grade Level Support*** PTA provides funds for each grade level to assist with special projects throughout the year (For example, 4th grade has a "Colonial Day" since the curriculum deals with Virginia history every year)

***Staff Development*** PTA reimburses staff members on registration fees for continuing education courses they may attend through out the year.

***Instructional Supplies*** PTA pays for certain instructional supplies that may be needed through out the year. In previous years the PTA has bought a new white board as well as two cameras and a mixer for the in-house studio

***Scholarships*** PTA pays for field trip costs for those families in need. Privacy is maintained and no one knows the families in need except the school administration.

***School Directory*** PTA provides a directory of all students and their mailing addresses and phone numbers to families who are PTA members. It is a great reference tool through out the year!

These are just a few examples of where your money goes when you participate in the PTA.

## Volunteer Opportunities

There are many opportunities to volunteer with activities throughout the year. You decide on how much time you can commit but every minute helps. The level of participation can be as high as volunteering to serve as an officer to making phone calls, sending emails or simply providing a baked good. Your help is critical in continuing to bring the good things to the kids. Without the help, many of the activities and programs our kids enjoy would not exist.

### ***Room Parent***

Room Parent is an important role that helps both the teachers and the PTA. At the start of school, teachers have sign up sheets in their classrooms with volunteer opportunities in your child's classroom.

Every classroom is in need of a room parent. This individual can be a mom or dad. Often, the room parent is actually a role shared by several parents. The classroom teachers provide the room parents with information and instructions regarding how they need help. Typically, the room parent helps coordinate classroom parties. The PTA also coordinates with the room parent(s) as a source for the PTA to communicate directly to the parents/guardians in each class. There are usually three main events that the PTA asks the room parent(s) to help with: the Silent Auction, the Carnival, and Staff Appreciation Week.

### ***Silent Auction***

The carnival and silent auction are held on the same day. Usually, the carnival coordinator meets with the room parents to give them a form, which the room parents then duplicate and send to the parents in their class. The form asks for two things: donations for the class basket (explained later) and/or one hour of volunteer time helping at the carnival. The class basket is based on an assigned theme there. After receiving donations (either items for the basket or money) the room parent puts the basket together and it is then auctioned off at the silent auction during the school carnival. 50% of the proceeds from the sale of the baskets go to the PTA and 50% goes back to each grade level equally.

### ***Carnival***

Each class is assigned a particular area of the carnival (for example, a game or the bake sale). This area is manned by parent volunteers. Everyone working together makes this a wonderful annual family event.

### ***Staff Appreciation Week***

The PTA's Hospitality committee plans activities for Staff Appreciation Week. The Committee will communicate the plan to the room parents, who then work with the parents in their classroom to assist with those activities. Usually the room parent(s) sends a flyer home to the parents to communicate the assistance needed with activities planned for that week. For example, in years past we have had all of the children sign their names on a large sheet of paper and then it was placed on the classroom door.

## **Fundraising/Income for the PTA**

PTA's are non-profits and monies are generated via fundraising events. At Powell we try to keep fundraising to a minimum. The following are the main Powell PTA fundraisers:

- **Selling of Sally Foster Gift Wrap**—occurs at the start of school in September and ends with paper delivered in October. This fundraiser has represented 48% of the operating monies for the PTA activities and is the biggest fundraiser of the year.
- **Silent Auction**—occurs in the winter during the school's carnival. Parents/community have the opportunity to bid on donated items, including class baskets. Items donated in the past include Four Day Hopper passes to Disney, local restaurants, visits to historical sites in Virginia, etc. In the past this has represented 19% of the monies for the PTA.

- **Carnival**—occurs in February/March at the school. It is an opportunity for families to come to the school and enjoy a day of kid friendly games, activities, music and food. The carnival and silent auction combined represent 27% of the PTA's income.
- **50/50 Raffle**—tickets are sold prior to the carnival with a winner identified during the carnival. The PTA keeps 50% of the proceeds and the winner gets 50%. In years past the winner has won \$2,000! The PTA typically has an identified need of equipment, etc., for which these funds will be used for.
- **Donations**—the PTA accepts monetary donations throughout the year.
- **Spirit Wear**—the PTA sells items with our school name and logo in the Fall and Spring. These items range from bumper stickers and pencils to tshirts and sweat pants. Our children love to show their school pride by wearing tshirts or sweatshirts with the Powell Puma on them!
- **BonusBucks**— This program is sponsored by Giant Food stores from October to April. By using your savings card and providing the store (one time) with a number identifying our school, a portion of every dollar you spend at the store will go to our school. In years past this money has bought the student agenda books (organizational notebooks with calendar for the school year and where students keep their class assignments)

## Activities Throughout the School Year

The PTA and the school work together to sponsor many activities throughout the year. In the coming months, you can expect to hear more information about the activities listed below. This list does not include all of the PTA programs or all of the school activities. Rather, a sample of some of the ones you will hear about most from the children. The PTA encourages you, your children, and your family to participate in some of these wonderful activities.

### *Sept, Oct., Nov, Dec.*

- Sally Foster Giftwrap Sale (PTA)** The PTA's largest fundraiser of the year. Catalogues and order forms are sent home through each child's class. Everyone has the opportunity to participate by selling giftwrap, chocolates and other items to family and friends.
- Reflections (PTA)** A national PTA recognition and achievement program. Students respond creatively (with their own literature, musical composition, photography and fine art) to a theme determined by the national PTA. All participants are recognized in an awards ceremony. Some entries proceed to the next level of competition.
- Chess club (PTA)** Children have the opportunity to learn how to play chess as well as chess strategies. Chess Club typically begins in the Fall and is held once a week, before school. Parents pay a fee for their child to participate.
- Corn Maze (PTA)** Families find their way through a large cornfield that has been made into a life-sized maze. The maze is located near Leesburg, Virginia.
- Red Ribbon Week (PTA)** A week focusing on preventing the abuse of alcohol, drugs, and tobacco. Typically our school celebrates the week through planned "spirit" activities each day of the week. For example, on "Wear Red Day" children are encouraged to wear red and on "Turn Your Back on Drugs" day, children are encouraged to turn their clothes backwards or inside out.
- Veteran's Day Program (school)** A program of musical and oratory presentations held during the school day in which students recognize the contributions of our nation's veterans.
- Holiday Shop (PTA)** An evening when students come to the school to purchase gifts for family and friends. Adults, middle school, and high school students help the children with their money and gift selection.
- Holiday Lunch (School)** A time set aside specifically for parents to come enjoy a special lunch in the cafeteria with their child. Usually, tickets are

purchased in advance for this event which has in past year's been held at Thanksgiving time. Tickets can be purchased the day of the event as well.

**Game Night (PTA)** Families bring a board game to school to share with other families for an evening fun and games!

### *Jan., Feb., March*

**Martin Luther King, Jr. Festival (School)** A celebration of the life of the Nobel Prize winner and civil rights leader through music, poetry, and dance. This event is sponsored by the Chantilly Pyramid Minority Achievement Committee. Children from our school participate under the guidance of one of the music teachers. The festival is held on a holiday (no school day) with children from many area elementary schools as well as middle schools and high schools.

**Movie Night (PTA)** Families come together for a night at the movies right at our school. A family movie is shown and popcorn is provided!

**Multicultural Night (PTA)** An evening for our school community to share in the diversity that makes up Powell by displaying their cultural traditions through music, dance, clothing, and food.

**McSpirit Night (PTA/School)** Families have the opportunity to go to a designated McDonalds restaurant one evening where they can see teachers working behind the counter. A portion of proceeds from the evening's purchases are given to the school.

**Winter Carnival (PTA)** A fun event for the entire community with games, music and food. Takes place on a weekend and typically in March.

**Silent Auction (PTA)** One of the main fundraising parts of the carnival. Businesses and individuals donate goods or services. Each class donates a themed basket, as well. The items are given to the individual who has placed the highest monetary bid (and therefore, purchased the item) at the end of the afternoon.

**Mad Scientist Program (PTA)** A program that encourages family participation.

**Read Across America (School)** A day in honor and celebration of author, Dr. Seuss's birthday. Guest readers come in during the school day to assist the teachers with reading stories. One of the most well known and beloved Dr. Seuss characters, the Cat in the Hat typically makes an appearance!

### *April, May, June*

**Book Fair (School)** A week to raise awareness about the importance of reading. Children and their families have the opportunity to visit the school library where many new books of all genres are displayed. The children write down what they'd like to purchase on "wish lists".

They then have the opportunity to return to the book fair at some time during the school day or in the evening with their families to purchase books. A portion of the proceeds from the Book Fair goes back to the school.

**Spaghetti Dinner (PTA)** An evening for families to come together to enjoy a meal together at school. Tickets are sold in advance. Usually, the spaghetti dinner is held on one of the evenings of the Book Fair.

**Family Day at Frying Pan Park (PTA)** A day designated for Families at nearby Frying Pan Park. The park will have various family activities which our Powell families may attend.

**Staff Appreciation Week (PTA)** This is a time for us to thank the wonderful staff members at Powell. It is always the first week of May and tied to a theme. There are activities through out the week to honor and thank our staff.

**Field Day (School)** A day of fun outside activities for all students. Classroom teachers usually ask for parent volunteers to help with the activities.

**Puma-nic (PTA)** Families are invited to come to school one evening with a blanket and their own picnic dinner. Dessert will be provided by the PTA.
